Read several LTEs to become familiar with the format and requirements.	
Select a current issue that is important to you and find out what other people think by searching reliable online or print sources. You will need to cite one or two experts in your LTE about the issue.	
Develop a position	
Use the writing process to deepen your understanding of the issue (draft, get feedback, rethink, draft some more, get more feedback, revise again). When you can articulate and support a clear position on the issue, you are ready for fine-tuning.
