Write five or more questions the survey respondent can answer with yes or no.
Write one question the survey respondent can answer with one or two sentences.
Ask a classmate to help you revise each question so it is easier to understand. If the questions are unclear, the survey results will be inaccurate.
Ask all the people in a group to complete the survey. The group might consist of all the members of your class, all the members of an after-school activity, all the teachers in your school, and so on.
Use your mathematics skills to convert the yes or no answers into percentages. You need to know what percentage of survey respondents answered yes and what percentage answered no for each question.
Make a graph that shows the survey results.
